

MOUNT KISCO DOG WINS.

Fernbrook Cleopatra Adjudged Best at Bulldog Show.

Fernbrook Cleopatra, an unusually fine specimen of the American-bred English bulldog, was accorded the honor of best dog in the match show of the American Bulldog Club, held last night at the Hotel Gregorian. This match show, which was held under sanction of the American Kennel Club, was more of a reunion of old-time fanciers of the English breed than a formal bench event.

Fernbrook Cleopatra, which is owned by the Fernbrook Kennels of Mount Kisco, did not have a very large field against her, but she would probably have won against a more formidable array of competitors, as her massive skull and tremendous upturn of the underjaw stamped her as an exceptional dog.

Walter Murray, owner of Thornbury Rajah, which was famous eight years ago, acted as judge, and Charles G. Hopten, who bred the first American-bred English bulldog, was Steward. A delegation of fanciers attended from Philadelphia, headed by Edwin L. Boger.
