On the 16th of June, 1931, the Club was incorporated as the Bulldog Club of New England in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Mr. Alfred O. The Club is the largest Specialty Bulldog Club in the States.

The Club meets every month, and holds a Specialty Show every year at the Horticultural Hall, Huntington Avenue, Boston, Mass., the date set for this year being December 9th, 1933. In addition the Club usually holds a Sanction or Match Show each spring, usually in or around Boston, Mass.
