

### OLD ENGLISH BULL-DOG

as adopted by the

#### BULL-DOG CLUB OF AMERICA

1896

If this perfect Bull-Bog must be of med um size and smooth coat; with General Appearance heavy thick set, low-awing body: massive short-faced head; wide Attitude shoulders and sturdy limbs.

Expression lite.

The general appearance and attitud should suggest great stability, almor and strength.

The disposition should be equable and kind, resolute and courageous that Vicious or higgressive), and the a meanor should be parific and dignified.

These attributes should be countenanced by the expression and behavior.

Galt

The style and carriage are peculiar, his gait being a loose-jointed, shuffling, sidewise motion, giving the characteristic "roll." The action must, however, be unrestrained, free and vigorous,

The "points" should be well distributed and bear good relation one Proportion to the others, no feature being in such prominence from either excess or Symmetry lack of quality that the animal appears deformed or illy proportioned.

Influence of Sex

In comparison of specimens of different sex, due allowance should be made in favor of the bitches, which do not bear the characteristics of the breed to the same degree of perfection and grandeur as do the dogs.

Size

The size for mature dogs is about 50 pounds; for mature bitches about 40 pounds.

Cont

The coat should be straight, short, flat, close, of fine texture, smooth and glossy. (No fringe, feather or curl.)

Color of Cont

The color of coat should be uniform, pure of its kind and brilliant. The various colors found in the breed are to be preferred in the following order:-

(1) Red brindle, (2) all other brindles, (3) solid white, (4) solid red. fawn or fallow, (5) piebald, (6) inferior qualities of all the foregoing.

(NOTE.—A perfect piebald is preferable to a middy brindle or de-

fective solid color.)

Solid black is very undesirable, but not so objectionable if occuring to a moderate degree in plebald patches. The brindles, to be perfect, should have a fine, even and equal distribution of the composite colors.

In brindles and solid colors a small white patch on the chest is not considered detrimental. In picbalds the color patches should be well defined, of pure color, and symmetrically distributed.

Skin

The skin should be soft and loose, especially at the head, neck and shoulders.

Wrinkle and Dewiap The head and face should be covered with heavy wrinkles, and at the throat, from jaw to chest, there should be two loose pendulous folds, forming the dewlap.

Skull

The skull should be very large, and in elecumference, in front of the ears, should measure at least the height of the dog at the shoulders.

Viewed from the front, it should appear very high from the corner of the lower jaw to the apex of the skull, and also very broad and square.

the lower jaw to the apex of the skull, and also very broad and square. Viewed at the side, the head should appear very high, and very short

from the point of the nose to occiput.

The forchead should be flat (not rounded or "domed"), neither too prominent, or overhanging the face.

Cheeks

The checks should be well rounded, protruding sidewiss and outward second the eyes.

Stop

The temples or frontal bones should be very well defined, broad, square and high, causing a hollow or groove between the eyes. This indentation, or "stop," should be both broad and deep and extend up the middle of the forehead, dividing the head vertically, being traceable to the top of the skull.

Eyes and Eyelids The eyes, seen from the front, should be situated low down in the shull, as far from the ears as possible, and their corners should be in a straight line at right angles with the stop. They should be quite in front of the head, as wide apart as possible, provided their outer corners are within the smiline of the cheeks when viewed from the front.

They should be quite round in form, of moderate size, neither aunken

nor bulging, and in color should be very dark.

The lids should cover the white of the eye-ball, when the dog is looking directly forward, and the lid should show no "haw."

Ears

The curs should be set high in the bond, the front inner edge of each ear joining the outline of the skull at the top back corner of skull, so as to place them as wide apart, and as high, and as far from the eyes as possible.

In size they should be small and thin. The shape termed "rose ear" is the most destrable. The "rose ear" folds inward at its back lower edge, the upper front edge curving over, outwards and backwards, showing part of the inside of the burr. (The ears should not be carried erect or "prick-cared" or "buttoned" and should never be cropped.)

Face

The face, measured from the front of the cheek bone to the tip of some, should be extremely short, the muzzle being very short, broad, turned appraris and very deep from the corner of the eye to the corner of the mouth.

Nose

The nese should be large, broad and black, its tip being set back deeply between the eyes.

The distance from the bottom of stop, between the eyes, to the tip of nose, should be as short as possible and not exceed the length from the

tip of none to the edge of under lip.

The nosirils should be wide, large and black, with a well-defined line between them. (The parti-color or "butterfly nose" and the flesh-color or "Dudley nose" are decidedly objectionable, but do not disqualify for competition.)

Chops

The chops or "flews" should be thick, broad, pendant and very deep, rempletely overhanging the lower jaw at each side.

They join the under lip in front and almost or quite cover the teeth, which should be scarcely notlesable when the mouth is closed.

Jaws The pure smooth is toucher, very local, square and "undershot," the lower jew projecting considerably in front of the upper jaw, and turning up.

Teeth

The teeth shound to large and attents, while the canine tooth or tusks wide apart, and the six small teeth in front, between the canines, in an even, level flow.

Neck The next, almost be share, very thick deep and strong, and well arched at the book.

Shoulders The shoulders should be muscular, very heavy, wide-spread and dunling conward, giving stability and gives power.

Chest The whest should be very bread, despends first.

Brisket and Body

The body should to well vilded up belyind with the belly tneked up, and not round.

Back

The back should be short and alrunt, very broad at the shoulder and comparatively more on at the injus. There should be a slight full in the back, since bothing the shoulders (its lowest part), whence the spine should rise to the back (the top of which should be higher than the top of the shoulders), there envelog again more suddenly to the tail, forming an arch to very distinctive fecture of the breed), termed "roachback," or, more correctly, "wheel-back."

Forelegs

The forelega should be short, very stout, straight and muscular, set wide apart, with well descloped calves, presenting a bowed outline, but the bones of the lega should not be curved or handy, nor the fret brought too close together.

Elbows

The elbows should be low, and stand well out and loose from the body.

Hindlegs

The hindless should be strong and muscular, and longer than the foreign, so us to elevate the loins above the shoulders.

Hocks should be slightly bent and well let down, so as to give length

and strength from loins to hock.

The lower leg should be short, straight and strong, with the stiffes turned slightly outward and away from the body. The books are thereby made to approach each other, and the hind feet to turn outward.

Feet

The feet should be moderate in rise, compact and firmly set. Toes compact, well split up, with high knuckles, and with short and stubby nails.

The front feet may be straight or slightly out-turned, but the hind feet should be pointed well outward.

Tail

The tail may be either straight or "screwed" (but never curved or curly), and in any case must be short, hung low, with decided downward carriage, thick root and fine tip.

If straight, the tail should be cylindrical and of uniform taper.

If "screwed" the bends or kinks should be well defined, and they may be abrupt and even knotty, but no portion of the member should be elevated above the base or root.

#### DEFINITION OF CLASSES.

(As referred to a Promine Late) Fig. A. K. C. Mules.

 The Puppy Class shall be for all dogs over six months and under twelve months of age, and no entry can be made of one under six months or whose date of birth is unless wn.

The Novice Class shall be for all dogs never having won a first prize at any recognized show, wins in the puppy classes excepted.

3. The Limit Class shall be for all dogs never having won four first prizes at any recognized show, wins in the puppy and novices' classes excepted.

4. The Open Class shall be for all dogs of any age over six months.

No prize winner shall be debarred from competing.

E. The Winners' Class shall be open only to the winners of first prizes at any show giving at least three of the before-mentioned classes, one of which must be the open class, and the winner of three first prizes in this class will thereby become a champion of record, be so registered by the American Kennel Club and will, if registered in the Stud Book, be entitled to an American Kennel Club champion medal. Before awarding "reserve" in this class, the dug or dogs having been placed second to the winner in any of the regular classes must be brought before the judge for competition with the remaining dogs in said Winners' Class. No class winner can be witheraws or withheld from competition in the Winners' Class, and no entry fee shall be charged for said competition in this class. A dog that has already won one or more first prizes in the late challenge class shall retain these wins to its credit toward becoming a champion of record, the remaining qualifying wins to be gained in the Winners' Class. The Winners' Class can be divided by sex, provided the required three classes, as advertised, are also divided by sex.
