Try to keep your pets inside, preferably in an isolated room or their kennel with their favorite bedding and safe toys.

Exercise your dog early in the day, they will be easier to handle and calmer overall.

During fireworks, keep your dog in a comfortable room. Turn on the radio or TV for familiar noise.

Have ID on your pet at all times and a current photo on hand, in case they get lost.

IF YOU CHOOSE TO TAKE YOUR DOG OUTSIDE, HERE ARE SOME SAFETY PRECAUTIONS.

Keep your dog away from fire and fireworks.

Watch for people dropping trash and food on the ground.

Be mindful of food you have sitting out. Some foods & beverages are deadly to dogs.

KEEP THEM COOL. Make sure they have access to fresh cool water. If they are showing signs of getting too warm or stressed, take them inside where it is cooler, they feel safe and calmer.
